

Pennsylvania, S. S.

By vertue of a warrant from the Proprietaries to me directed bearing date the twenty ninth day of the 5th Month [July] A. D. 1734. Resurveyed on the 19 day of Septembr. A. D. 1739 to Samuel Carpenter of the City of Philadelphia that part of the Island now in his possession lying on the side of Delaware River below the Mouth of Schuylkil first Granted by the Governour of New York unto Peter Cock since deceased; under whose Heirs the said Samuel Carpenter now holds the same. The said part of the aforesd Island being bounded on the North and on the West by Boon's Creek [which divides the said Samuel Carpenter's part of the sd Island from Boon's Island] on the East by Eagle Creek [which divides the sd Samuel Carpenter's part from John Fishers part of the said Island] and on the South by the River Delaware containing six hundred seventy five Acres Returned into the Secretary's Office the 10th day of October. Anno Dom 1734.
