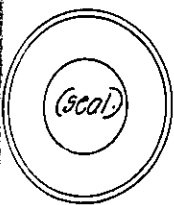


Pensylvania ss.

Upon an Agreement made between us ~~and~~ in behalf of the Propriet^r and John Walker of Philad^{ia}, Popemaker, for a certain Tract of Ground joyning upon Vine Street beyond the Northern bounds of the City, Philadelphia running backwards from the Lots now in the possession of Thomas Wills ye ^{full} breadth of the said Wills his Lots till it take in the quantity of Six acres for which he is to pay to the Proprietor the Yearly Rent of Ten Shills Sterling Money for every acre thereof upon the first day of the first month Yearly for the space of twenty one years after the date hereof & ¹⁵/₄ then to revert to the Proprietor: These are to Authorize and require thee to survey and lay out the said piece of Ground to the s^d John Walker of the breadth and quantity aforesaid, running the whole length by the Northern Edge of Vine Street untill it take in the said quantity of Six Acres, and make Returns into the General Surveyors Office where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv^d to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 16th day of the 5th Moth 1705.
