 retaries Office. ~~and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office~~ Which Survey in case the said Robert fulfill his  
 said Agreemt within Nine Months after the Date hereof & further pay six Months interest  
 at ye said time for forbearance of the said Thirty Pounds, shall be valid otherwise the same is to  
 be void and of no Effect as if it had never been made nor this Warrt ever Granted. Given under
