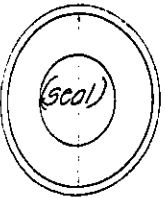

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in
Chief of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Margaret Wooller Widow of Rich^d Wooller by her Att-
orney Anthony Chishull That I would grant her to take up ~~four~~^{four} hundred ^{and ninety} Acres of Land
purchased by her sd. husband and formerly granted to be taken up by a Warr^t
from my self bearing date the 16th of the 12^{mo} 168⁴/₅ These are to require thee
forthwith to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto her according to the Method
of Townships by me appointed the said Number of ~~four~~^{four} hundred ^{and ninety} Acres of Land
in this Province that has not been already taken up nor Survey'd nor is con-
cealed nor seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries
Office which survey being duly made and returned, shall, in case she ~~shall~~ seat and
improve or cause the same to be seated and improved within twelve months
after ~~it~~ shall be laid out, be confirmed unto her & her heirs &c Assigns for ever
Given under my hand and seal at Philadelphia the 22^d of the 12th Moth 170⁹
