William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Governour in Chief  
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Joseph Willcox, that I would grant him to take up a Lott  
In the City of Philadelphia in right of his Father Barnabas Willcox's purchase of  
one thousand Acres made in this Province. These are to require thee forthwith  
to survey or cause to be survey'd to the sd Joseph Willcox a Lott in the Second  
street of fifty one foot in breadth adjoining on the Lott where he now lives  
and make Returns thereof into My Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand  
and Seal at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 18<sup>th</sup> of the 7<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
