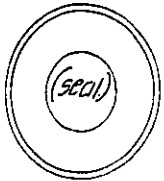

in Chief of the Province of Pennsilva and Counties Annexed.

In Pursuance of my warrant formerly granted for Laying out of the Land sold to John Wilmore purchaser in England of three thousand Acres. These are to will and require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto him in the first Township that shall be laid out in this Province, next after the date hereof five hundred Acres of Land not already taken up, Survey'd, nor concealed: He or his Attorney taking out a Patent for the same within three months after thou shalt make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office, w^{ch} thou art hereby required to doe with all convenient Speed. Given under my Hand and Seal at Pensbury the 2^d day of the 7th Moth, 1700.
