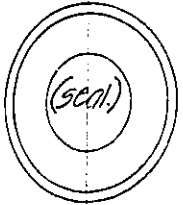


Pensilvania: }



William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern^r in Chief
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Thomas Wickersham That I would grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in right of Humphry Killinbeck first purchaser of one thousand Acres together with the City Lotts and Liberty Land included belonging to the said thousand Acres. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or ^{unto him} cause to be Survey'd, according to the Method of Townships by me appointed the 5^d Number of 500 Acres (the proportion of Liberty Land deducted) where it has not been already Survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed, nor Seated by the Indians, he improving the same within twelve months after the date of Survey, also to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to y^e 5^d Thomas Wickersham his proportion of Land in the Liberties of Philadelphia and his City Lotts where they fell, of all w^{ch} make one Return into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand & Seal at Philad^{ia} the 21st of the first Moth, 170⁹.
