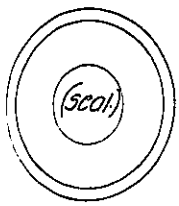


Pennsylvania, ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Robert Burroughs in behalf of the Heirs of John Weight late of Worcester in Great Britain. That we would grant them to take up Seven hundred and twenty five Acres of Land in this Province remaining of the Original Purchase of twelve hundred & fifty Acres made by W^m Pardoe & by him assign'd to the s^d John Weight. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the use of the s^d Heirs in the Right aforesd according to ye method of Townships appointed the s^d quantity of Seven hundred and twenty five Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands & seal of ye Province at Philad^a the 21st day of ye first Month (March) 170⁸/₉.
