By vertue of a warrant from the Proprietary & Govern<sup>rs</sup> of this Province & dated this day and directed to me to Survey or cause to be surveyed unto Barnabas Willcox, Purchaser, Two hundred Acres in a place not already taken up on Skookill Creek; according to the Method of Townships appointed by him & I hereby authorize thee to Survey & set out the said quantity of Land there accordingly and because the Purchaser Alledgeth that the Govern<sup>rs</sup> intended that this Land should be pt of the Land formerly taken up by Wm. Smith & being that the Govern<sup>rs</sup> hath not sae Express it in his said Warrant to me as alsoe for that ~~that~~ the Lands thereabouts are said to be w<sup>th</sup>in the Compass & bounds of Lands taken into the City therefore thou art to Observe the Govern<sup>rs</sup> direction to thee therein still to minde the Rule of ~~one~~ twenty Pole to the hundred Acres by the said Creek side according to former orders & practices in the like case Unless the Govern<sup>rs</sup> Order thee to Alter the same & to make a Returne to me of the Originall field work & Protracted figure w<sup>ch</sup> by my patent is to remain in my office.
