

By Vertue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Survey^r General^r bearing dat the 12th day of the 8th month 1700 directed unto me I do hereby Certiefy into his Office that I haive survey'd the 8th of the 19th m^o Ensueing unto John Willmar a Certaine tract of Land in the Township of Limbrick in the County of Philladelphia beginneing at a post by a street or Roade Leading through the said Township being a Corner post deviding it from a Certain tract of Land Laid out for the propriatory prop^{rs} use and betroof from thenc south west by the said ~~Lead~~ Land by a Line of marked trees five hundred perches to a post sett in the ground from thenc North west by a Line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to another post sett in the ground from thenc North East by a Line of marked trees five hundred perches to a post by the said street or Road from thenc by the same South East one hundred and sixty perches to the plac of beginneing Containeing and Laid out for five hundred acres of Land.
