By vertue of a warrant from ye Propriet^r & Govern^r &c. dated ye thirtieth of ye last moneth, directed unto me, to Survey or cause to be surveyed to Jonathan Wiscard, renter, one hundred acres of Land about ye falls, behind ye purchasers, in a place not already taken up, & according to ye method of Townships, appointed by^e ye Govern^r. I therefore hereby authorize thee, to survey & set out ye said quantity of Land unto him accordingly, so yt I do not contradict any former warrant from me, to other persons, for lands behind ye purchasers, nor yet on ye back of Jno: Parsons & Andrew Ellots lands & when done to make me a true return of ye original field work & protracted figure, w^{ch} by my pattent are to remain in my office. Dated ye 15th of 12th moth, 1682.
