At ye Request of William Wood, Purchaser of five Thousand acres y^t wee would grant him to take up two hundred Acres of Land joyning upon Mill Creek on one side & Peter Yankins on ye other side on Skulkill side; These are in ye Proprietary's Name to will & require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto him y^e s^d Land ^{be it more or less} (being formerly granted & a Warrant signed by ye Govern^r, but mislayd) if not already taken up or fall th in ye Bounds of ye Liberty Land, he seating & improving y^e same th in six Months from ye Date of Survey, & make returns thereof into ye Secretary's Office Given at Philadelphia, ye 30th 7^{br}, 1684
