

Philadelphia, May 22^d: 1772.

Philip Steinmetz on the twenty third Day of March, 1771 obtained a Warrant for eighty Acres of Land adjoining his other Land and the Proprietary Tract in Macungie Township, Northampton County which Land demanded is found to lye in the Proprietary ~~Manor~~ two thousand Acre-Tract of Macung Barnes and therefore cannot be held on the Common Terms. The said Philip Steinmetz hath this day agreed to pay to the Honourable the said Proprietors the sum of five Shillings lawful Money of Pennsylvania per acre of the same And the yearly Quit Rent of one half Penny Sterling per acre: You are therefore to ~~make~~^{order} the same, ^{to be surveyed} to the sd Philip Steinmetz and ~~make~~ Return ^{dⁱⁿ} to the Surveyor Generals Office

I Philip Steinmetz do promise and agree to pay to the Honourable the Proprietors of Pennsy^a or their Receiver General the sum of five Shillings for ever acre of the aboves^d Land so to me to be Surveyed and the yearly Quit Rent of one half Penny Sterling for every acre of the same within six months after the Date hereof Witness my Hand the 22^d May, 1772.
