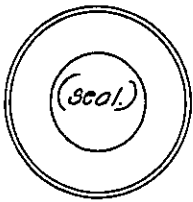


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Jonathan Wynne Son & Heir of Thomas Wynne deceased Joint Purchaser with John ap John of five thousand Acres of Land in this Province That we would grant him to take up four hundred Acres in part of what he alledges remains untaken up of the Purchase aforesaid: These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and layout to the sd Jonathan Wynne the sd quantity of four hundred Acres of Land in the Welch Tract if there to be found vacant, or elsewhere according to the method of Townships where not surveyd nor conceald nor seated by the Indians and make Returns by a Copy of this certified ~~copy~~ by the Secretary into the Surveyors General's Office, which sd survey, in case the sd Jonathan have a right to so much yet untaken up shall be valid, otherwise shall be void and of no effect. Given under our hands and the Province Seal at Philad^a the 18th of the 4th Month 1705.
