


Pennsylvania ss:

By the Commissioners of Property.



Upon an agreement made with William Fleming of the County of Chester for two Hundred acres of Land nere the Western branch of Brandywine Creek & xx between the Land where the said William Fleming Dwells and the Land of James Waffer for which he is to pay to the Propriet<sup>es</sup> use thirty pounds Current Silver for ye whole vermony of America, and the usual Quit Yearly Quitrent of one English Shilling for Each Hundred Acres.

These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said William Fleming the Said Quantity of Two Hundred Acres of Land in the place aforesd, provided the same has not been Already Survey'd nor appropriated nor under any lawful Clai<sup>m</sup>e of other persons and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in ord<sup>r</sup> to a further Confirmation which said Survey in case the Said William Fleming fulfill the above said Agreement within three Months after Location shall be valid otherwise the same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant Ever Granted. Given under our hands and seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 26<sup>th</sup>. day of the third Month Anno Domini 1714.
