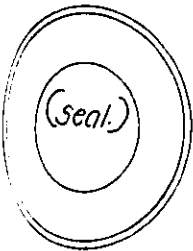


Pensylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Philip Fierre of New Strasburg That we would grant him to take up three Hundred Acres of Land in the said Township near Pecquean Creek, for which he agrees to pay after the Rate of ten Pounds for each hundred and the yearly Quitrent of One Shilling Sterling for ever: These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the sd Philip according to the Method of Township the said quantity of three hundred Acres or more as it shall suit him of Vacant Land in the place aforesaid, and make a Return thereof in to the Secretaries Office which Survey in case the said Philip shall pay the said Consideration Money within three months after the date hereof shall be valid, otherwise to be void and of no Effect as if the same had never been made nor this Warrt ever Granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 24th day of the 6th Month A.D. 1716.
