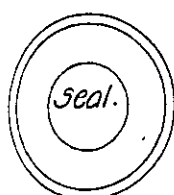

By the Commission<sup>rs</sup> of Property.

Whereas there has been Survey'd & Granted to Mary Fincher deceased, a certain Tract of Land in the County of Chester containing Nine hundred & Sixty five Acres on part of the Welch Tract where some of the Welch Purchasers had a prior Right and therefore cannot be enjoyed by ye Heirs of the sd Mary Fincher in ye sd place but part thereof must be located elsewhere: These therefore are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey unto John Fincher eldest son of Francis Fincher Purchaser of ye sd Land & former husband to Mary aforesd in whom ye Right to ye sd Land is now solely invested so much of the aforesd Tract w<sup>th</sup> in ye aforesd Welch Bounds as is not laid out to any of the sd Welch Purchasers also to Survey to ye sd John in some other place as convenient as may be found in ye sd County, the full Complement wanting in ye sd land not taken up by ye Welch Purchasers to make up ye same Seven hundred & fifteen Acres w<sup>th</sup> suitable Allowance of Such Land as hath not been duly Survey'd to any other, & make Returns into ye General Surveyor's Office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain & a Copy thereof to be delvd. to thee certified by ye Secretary. Given under our hands & ye Seal of ye Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>mo</sup> 1702.
