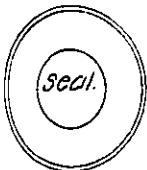

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern<sup>r</sup> in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Edward Jones. These are to require thee forthwith to

Survey or cause to be survey'd to Jonathan Wynne one hundred Acres of the land he is now seated on, upon the west side of Skuylkill beginning at Clan Johns corner tree and to Survey the remainder of the adjacent Vacant Land together with fifty Acres also adjoining to the s<sup>d</sup> Edward Jones and make returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 9<sup>th</sup> day of 8<sup>ber</sup> 1701.
