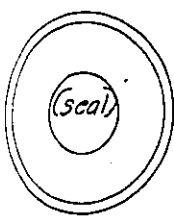


Pensylvania ss.

These therefore are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Jonathan in the Welch Tract in this Province the said quantity of Seven hundred & twenty five Acres of Land that is vacant & not yet survey'd to others and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the Sixth day of December in ye sixth Year of the Reign of Queen Anne, A. D. 1707.
