Upon Request of John Fish y<sup>t</sup> I would grant to him to take up Two hundred  
& fifty Acres of Land he hath purchased, & next to it more two hundred & fifty Acres  
head Land for him self, his wife, one son & two servants, about Hashamein Creek;  
Also four hundred Acres upon rent near Skulkill: These are to will & require thee forth-  
w<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd y<sup>e</sup> five hundred Acres at Hashamein Creek in a  
place wher~~e~~ not already taken up & y<sup>e</sup> four hundred Acres at least four miles  
from Skulkill Creek & both in y<sup>e</sup> way & method agreed on for Townships & this  
shall be thy Warrant Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 23<sup>d</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> Mo. 1682.
