(Seal) These are to authorize and require you to survey or cause to be surveyed Five thousand acres of Land on Delaware to begin about a Mile above Station point Rock &c to extend downwards about three Miles on the River Also Two thousand Acres on Delaware to include the Mouth of a Creek Called by the Delawares "Equininch" and by the Oneidas "Gasgondalage" And one thousand five hundred Acres on Delaware opposite to a place known by the name of Cookhouse to include a large Branch running into the West side of Delaware and to make Returns thereof into our Secretary's Office for our use And for doing this shall be your sufficient Warrant Witness John Penn Esq^r: One of the said Proprietaries who as well in his own Right as by virtue of certain powers from ~~the~~ Thomas Penn, Esq^r: the other Proprietary hath hereunto set his Hand and caused the Seal of the Land Office to be affixed at Philadelphia this Eighth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred & Seventy three
