By virtue of a warrant from the Prop<sup>rs</sup> Commission<sup>s</sup> bearing date ye 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup> mo. 169<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> directed to the Surv<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> I do by authority from him Certifie into the Secretaries Office, That (ob<sup>d</sup>) was on ye 17<sup>th</sup> day of the same month Surveyd & laid out unto William Wardner a piece or parcell of Swamp on ye west side of Schuylkill, Between John Wardners & William Woods Beginning at a white oak. Thence East by ye Said Warners Land nine p<sup>er</sup>ches to a Corner tree standing by ye Schuylkill Thence along the Sev<sup>l</sup> Courses thereof To a Corner post of William Wood & Comp<sup>ys</sup> Land, Thence North sixty seven degrees west - Eighteen p<sup>er</sup>ches to a Corn<sup>r</sup> Hickery Tree from thence south twenty nine degrees westerly Twenty four perches, To a Corner Oak saplin from thence along the several Courses along ye fast land to a Corner oak saplin standing by the side of a sm<sup>ll</sup> Runn from thence directly on a straight Line to the first marked white oak Containeing Ten acres, and is accord<sup>ly</sup> Entred in the Surv<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>s office the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the second month, 1694 CH.
