I hereby Certifie into his Secretaryes Office yt I have Caused to be Surveyed and Laid out ye 20th of ye 7th Moneth 1684 unto George Williards, Purchas^{er} ~~(to be)~~ ~~(to be)~~ Land in ye Liberties of ye City of Philadelphia & Begining at a Corn^r marked post standing by ye Land Belonging unto Enoch Flow^r from thence ~~north~~ Eastnorth East by ye Land belonging to Thomas Rudyard fifty Six perches and a halfe to a Corn^r marked post from thence north north East by a Line of marked trees fifty Six perches and a halfe to a Corn^r marked post from thence West South West by a Line of marked trees fifty Six perches and a halfe to a corn^r marked post standing by ye Land belonging unto Jn^o Longhurst and Company from thence south, South East by ye aforementioned Enoch Flow^rs Land fifty six perches and a halfe to ye first mentioned place of begining containing and Laid out as above for Twenty acres of Land, And is accordingly Entred. and Recorded in my office Philadelphia this 22^d of ye 5th mo. 1685.
