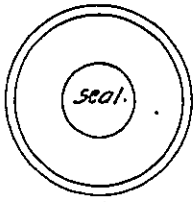


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Jonathan Wynne Son of Thomas Wynne, deceased, that we would Grant him to take up twenty four Acres of Land within the Liberties of the City Philadelphia beyond Skuylkill, remaining due to him, as it appears, in right of his said father's Original Purchase of two thousand five hundred acres: These are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Jonathan the said quantity of twenty four Acres of Land where it is to be found vacant and not appropriated within the said Liberties beyond Skuylkill, and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the eighth day of the third Month in the Seventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Queen Anne over Great Britain &c. Anno Dom. 1708.
