At the Request of Richard Webb That we would Grant him to take up Two hundred and fifty Acres of Land Originally Purchased by Thomas Hayward of Charle-
cot in the County of Wills, Searge Maker by Deeds dated ye 23^d & 24th dayes of Sep-
tembe 1681 & Assigned by the said Thomas to the said Richard & Elizabeth his
wife by an Indorsement dated ye 11th of January 1710. These are to Authorize and
Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the said Richard Webb ~~these~~ accord-
ing to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred and fifty
Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is
seated by the Indians ~~and~~ as also to lay out to the said Richard a Lott in the City of
Philadelphia proportionable to the said Purchase where it first fell by allotment
if vacant there, or as near to ye same (if not vacant) as it may be had and
make Returns of both Surveys into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands
and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 20th of ye 4th Moth, 1712.
