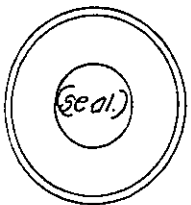


Pennsylvania.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Richard Webb of the County of Chester, That we would Grant him to take up Two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land in this Province for which he hath Agreed to pay to the Proprietors Use Five and Twenty Pounds and the usual Yearly Quittr<sup>t</sup> of One Shilling Sterling & Hundred: These are to Authorize and Require thee to surveyor cause to be survey'd to the said Richard Webb according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said quantity of Two hundred and fifty Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is Seated by the Indians, and make a Return thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey <sup>within three months</sup> in case the said Richard Fulfill the agreem<sup>t</sup> aforesd shall be valid, otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect, as if it had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 23<sup>d</sup> day of the first month A. D. 1713/4.
