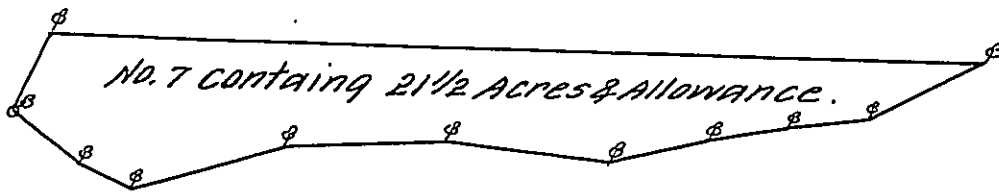


Upper End.
