

In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property Dated the 21st day of the 3^d Month 1719 There was Surveyed and Laid out the 28th day of the first Month 1720 unto James Steel of the City of Philadelphia a Certain Lot of Ground in the said City appurtenant to the Original Purchase of Joseph and Daniel Milner The said Lot being in Breadth Sixty Seven foot and one half foot and in Length One hundred ninety five foot. Bounded Northward with a Lot Reputed Vacant on the East with ^{at the Extent of 300 from 5^d 2^d Street} the Ends of the Second Street Lots, Southward with a Lot Laid out to Samuel Finney and on the West with the Third Street from Delaware. Returned into the Secretary's Office the Second day of April in the Year 1720.
