


By Vertue of a warrant from the Commissioners of property dated the 5th day of the third Month 1719 Survey'd and laid out unto James Steel of the City of Philadelphia in Right of William Bacons Original purchase a certain Tract or parcel of Land Scituate in Chester County Beginning at a Corner marked black OAK on the East Side of a Branch of Octoraro Creek from thence North by a Line of marked trees 106 perches to a post. Then West 160 perches to another post. Then South 106 perches to a third post then East One hundred & sixty perches to the place of Beginning. Containing One hundred and Six Acres. Survey'd the 21st. Day of December 1722.
