

In Pursuance of a warrant under the hands and Seals of ~~the~~ Charles Read Job Goodson George ffitzwater and Joseph Pidgeon Trustees for the ffree Society of Traders in Pennsylvania. dated the 25th day of March Anno 1724. Requesting me to Survey [or cause to be Surveyed] unto James Steel One thousand acres of Land in this Province in Part of 20000 acres purchased by the said Society This may certifie that on the 16th day of April in the same year There was Surveyed to the said James Steel a certain Tract Land in the County of Bucks Beginning at a white Oak at a corner of William ffishbourn's land in or near the Boundaries of warmins^r Township and Running thence North West by the said ffishbourn's Line four hundred and Sixteen perches to a white Oak Then by ^{Land Reputed.} Vacant North East four hundred and Six perches to a Corner post in a Line of Benj Hurley's land. Then South East by the same four hundred and sixteen pches to another corner post Thence South west by a Line of Marked trees four hundred and six perches to the place of Beginning Containing the above mentioned quantity of One thousand Acres Returned into the Secretary's Office the the 30th day of April, 1724.
