Twenty five Acres, in all four thousand five hundred Acres.**That I would grant them to take up their Proportion of Land in the
Liberties of the City Philadelphia; These are to will and require
thee forthwith to survey or cause to be Surveyd unto them Seventy
two Acres th win the Bounds of the Said Liberties They Seating and
Improving ye Same according to Regulations and make Returns
thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and
