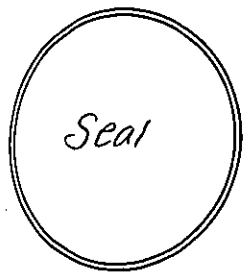

Whereas the late Commissioners of Property by their Warrant dated the 10th day of ye 4th Moth 1725— directed the Surveyor General to lay out to William Passmore the Lotts of Ground belonging to ye Original Purchase of One Thousand Acres made of our Deceased Father by Richard Webb of Kingston upon Thames. But there being no front Lot then to be found Vacant the said William requested to have in lieu thereof a piece of Ground added to his high Street Lott, and the said William Passmore being Since Dead and the Addition not being made, his Brother in law Joshua Fielding has applied for Compleating the Same, These are therefore to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out to the Heirs of the Said William Passmore on the West Side of the Lott laid out in the high Street the quantity of Six & Twenty feet & a half fronting the said high Street and to Continue the Same breadth Southward to Chesnut Street bounding the Same on the Said Streets, and make Returne into the Secretarys Office in order for Confirmation, Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of our Province at Philad^a the 16th day of ye first Moth (March) 173^{2/3}
