



By Vertue of a war^t from Edward Penington Survey^r Gen^l bearing date the 12th Day of the 8th m^o 1700 directed unto me I do hereby Certiefy into his office that I have Rec^d Survaid unto Cristopher Penock a Certaine tract of Land in the City Liberty of philladelphia upon the West Sid^e of Scoll=
=keel being Land formerlie Survaid unto George Collet and Company — beginneing at a Corner Stak^s Set in ye Ground, from thenc^e West by a Line of trees marked one hundred and forty Six perches from thenc^e by a Line of trees marked West 31 degrees South ^{fifty perches} to a Corner Stak^s Set in the ground from thenc^e North by a Line of trees marked Ninety Eight p^rches to a post in the Line of William Robarts Land from thenc^e by the Said Line East 23 degrees North 46 p^rches thenc^e East by a Line of trees marked one hundred forty & Six perches to another Stak^s Set in the Ground from thenc^e South by a Line of trees marked Ninety two p^rches to the plac^e of beginneing Containeing one hundred and Nine acres & ²⁴/₁₀₀ p^rches Survaid ye 20th of the Same m^o pr Me David Powell

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this 6th day of January 1900
