



Pursuant to two Warrants dated the 10th & 11th days of June 1725. for 750 acres Surveyd & laid out for William Passmore a Tract of ^{Land} Situate in the County of Philad^a on a branch of Perkiomy Creek beginning at A White Oak Saplin in the line of Samuel Powells land thence by the Same South West three hundred & thirty perches to a Black Oak in the ^{line of the} said Samuel Powells land thence by ~~the~~ ^{Cartmells} Land South East Three hundred Twenty Two perches to a post in the line of John Penns Manour Thence by the Same North forty Degrees East Three hundred thirty One perches to a Small B Oak Saplin thence by Vac^t Land North West Two hundred Ninety five perches to the place of begining Containing Six hundred Acres of Land With Allowance of Six p Cent Surveyd June 11th 1728
