The above Discribed Island situate in Susquehannah River opposite the Mouth Swattarrow Creek Known by the name of Poplar Island Containing Eight Acres and a half and the Usual Allowance of 6 pot By <sup>Warrant</sup> of the Seventh of July 1762 p. Bartram Galbraith.
