upon ye same wth in Six Months & improving ye Land wth in One year
from ye Date of Survey, & make returns thereof into the Secretary's
Office, Given at Philadelphia ye 12th ^{7th} Mo 1684
ye 2^d of 10th Ord^{ed}: DP to lay it out among the
Welshmen for the Conveniency of ye poor Woman
