

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 20th day of the third month 1725 there was Surveyd and laid out on the 25th of February 1728 unto Isaac Penington a piece of Land on a branch of Perkiomy Creek in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a hickery tree at a Corner of Derick Johnsens Land Thence North East 220 perches to a White Oak Then North West One hundred Seventy Seven perches to a black oak Then South West 140 pches. Then South East ²⁸ perches Then South ~~East~~ West 80 perches to a Great black Oak Then by the Said Derick Johnsens land South East One hundred and Seventeen perches to the place of beginning Containing two hundred acres with addition of Six per Cent.
