

Begining at ye mouth of a Small Creek Called Coo-ahquenanique
 from thence running up Several Courses of ye S^d Creek to the North ~~end~~^{end}
 of Coo-ahquenanique Bridge from thence North & by West along by
 ye West Side of a piece of Meadow 112 perches to a Corner marked
 black oak Standing at ye upper end of the S^d meadow -
 from thence North East 184 perches by a line of marked Trees
 to a Corner marked White Oak Standing at ye South West Side of
 a branch of Chohocsinks Creek from thence down along Several Courses
 of the S^d branch to ye Main River and so along ye River Side to ye
 place of Begining Containing 450 Acres.
