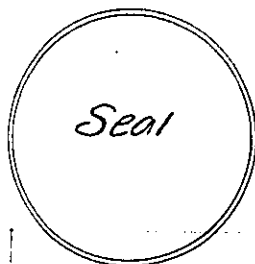

These are to authorize and require you to Survey & lay out for our Use in Right and as part of our tenths the quantity of Five Thousand Acres of Land at Shamokin on the River Susquehanna to include the old Fort and the Lands about it and make Return thereof into our Secretarys Office for which this shall be your Sufficient Warrant. Witness John Penn Esq^r Lieutenant Governor of the said province who by Virtue of certain powers from the said proprietaries hath hereunto set his Hand & caused the Seal of the Land Office to be affixed at Philadelphia this Twenty ninth Day of October A^o dⁱ. One thousand Seven hundred & Sixty eight.
