These are to authorize and require you to Survey & lay out for our Use the Quantity of Two Thousand Acres of Land at Nescopeck on the South Side of the East Branch of Susquehanna and to include another Small Indian Settlement between Nescopeck & Wyoming and make Return thereof into our Secretarys Office, And for so doing this shall be your sufficient Warrant, Witness John Penn Esq. Lieutenant Governor & Commissioner of Property of the said Province who by virtue of certain powers from the S^d proprietaries hath hereunto set his Hand & caused the Seal of the Land Office to be affixed at Philadelphia this twenty seventh Day of December One thousand Seven hundred & Sixty eight
