Whereas divers Persons have presumed to destroy the Timber and committ waste on a certain Island situate in the River Sasquahanna opposite to a Tract of Land lying on the East side of the said River and within the Township of Pexton, belonging to John Chambers, and which Island is computed to contain one hundred Acres. and is commonly called Millegans Island, and the said Persons without any Right whatsoever, or Licence from us have taken upon them to clear part of the said Island, And now we being desirous to prevent such waste and Spoil being made on the said Island for the future, and that the same shall be forthwith Surveyed and Returned for our use; These are therefore to will and require you, in Virtue hereof, and of our General warrant for that purpose dated the — day of — 17— to Survey, or cause to be Surveyed, the said Island, and to make Return thereof under a proper description into our Secretaries Office for our Use; And for your so doing this shall be a sufficient Warrant. Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Land Office, by virtue of certain powers from the said proprietaries, at Philadelphia this twenty eighth day of March Anno Dom. 1760.
