



By Vertue of Warrent from the Commissioners of property Dated philad. ye 20<sup>th</sup> of December 1727. Surveyed and Seet out to John Bond of Abington this Tract of Land as followeth that is to say Begining at a White Oak Tree being a Corner of Joseph Gilbert Land, Thence by John Lesters Land West 136 perches to a White oak Tree, Thence North by W<sup>m</sup> Tidmarsh Land 20 perches to White oak Tree Thence by the sd. Tidmarsh Land West 82 perches to White oak Tree Thence North by a line of Marked Trees 182 perches to a black Tree, Thence East by line of Marked Trees 218 perches to a post, Thence South by Joseph Gilberts Land 202 perches to the first Mentioned place of Begining Containing 250 Acres w<sup>th</sup> allowance at 6 per Cent. Lyeing in Great swamp Bucks County surveyed April ye 11<sup>th</sup> 1728
