 perches to a post sett in the ground from thenc North by  
 a Line of marked trees 112 perches to the plac of begine-  
 ing Containeing and Laid out for one hundred acres of Land  
 y<sup>e</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> mo. 1700 P<sup>r</sup> Me David Powell
