



By Order from James Steel of the 14<sup>th</sup> June 1720 Survey'd to George Hudson on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October then next ensuing the above described Tract of Land containing three Hundred and fourteen acres & the Usual Allowance.

Situate on a branch of Conestogoe Creek - - In<sup>d</sup> Taylor in Lancaster County

A Warrant to George Hudson for 200<sup>ac</sup> from the late Commissioners of Property dated the 14<sup>th</sup> of the 4<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1720

And this Land is situate in Carravon Township Lancaster County
