Upon an Agreement made with Christian Pennerman and John George Trelinger who lately arrived here from Germany for six hundred acres of Land to be laid out to them between the French Creek & the River Schuylkill for which they are to pay to the proprietaries Use Ninety pounds Money of this Province for the whole and the Yearly Quit rent of One Shilling Sterling for every hundred ~~hundred~~ Acres. These are to authorize and require thee 600 acres to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the said Christian Pennerman & John George Trelinger in the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of Six hundred Acres of Land that hath not been already Surveyed nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office within three months after the date hereof which Survey in Case the said Christian Pennerman and John George Trelinger or either of them pay down at the Survey of the above said Land five & forty pounds and the Remainder within Six months after the Date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands & seal of the province at Philadelphia the 21st 10th A.D. 1717
