At the request of Hans Shank now of Conestogo in this Province That we would grant him to take up by a branch of Conestogo Creek y<sup>e</sup> quantity of TWO HUNDRED acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> Use Twenty pounds Money of Pensylvania for the whole and the Yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each Hundred acres These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Hans Shank in the Place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed y<sup>e</sup> said quantity of two hundred acres of Land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office which Survey in case y<sup>e</sup> Said Hans fulfill y<sup>e</sup> above agreement within three Months after the date hereof Shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the Third Month anno Dom 1718
