At the Request of William Sherred That we would grant him TWO HUNDRED Acres of Land on Pequa Creek for which he has agreed to pay to the Proprietors Use Twenty pounds for the whole and the Usual Quittrent of One Shilling Sterling Yearly for each hundred Acres for ever These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the Said William Sherred Two hundred acres of Vacant Land on the Said Creek in one regular piece and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Which Survey in case the sd William Shall duly fulfill the aforesd Agreemt in paying the sd Consideration Money within three Months after the date hereof. _____ Shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever Granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad'l' the 28th day of the 4th Month AD 1715
