*At the Request of John Stringer of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up amongst the new Surveyse made back of the Said County the quantity of ffive hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay ~~to pay~~ to the Propriet<sup>r</sup>s Use ffifty Pounds Money of Pensylvania for the whole & the yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for every hundred acres hereof These are to Authorize & Require thee to survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Stringer in the back part of the said County according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of ffive hundred acres of Land that hath not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office in Order for a further Confirmation, which Survey in case the said John Stringer fulfill the above agreement within three Month after the date hereof. Shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> ye 18<sup>th</sup> ye Anno Din 1717*
