Upon an Agreement made with Jacob Stauber late of Zurich in Switzerland for five hundred Acres of Land to be laid out between the French Creek and Skuykill on the West Side of the said River for which he is to pay to the Proprietors use sixty pounds of lawful Money of this Province, ten pounds thereof in hand, and twenty five pounds on the tenth day of October next, and the remaining five and twenty pounds with Six Months Interest for y<sup>e</sup> Same on the tenth day of the Second Month (April) in y<sup>e</sup> Year One thousand Seven hundred and Fourteen: These are to authorize thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Jacob Stauber the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land in the place aforesaid in one regular Tract as near as the Barrens will allow to the Surveys already made and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey to be by thee made as aforesaid, shall, in case the Said Jacob comply with the said Agreement be good & valid, otherwise the same shall be void and of no Effect, as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 8<sup>th</sup> day of the Second Month AD 1713
