*At the Request of Michael Shank of the Township of Strasburg in this Province that We would grant him to take up in or near the said Township the quantity of two hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> Use twenty Pounds Money of the sd Province for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Michael Shank in or near the place afore said according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of Land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said ~~the said~~ Michael fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof Shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands & Seal of the Province ~~the~~ ~~Province~~ at Philadelphia the 27<sup>th</sup> day of Septemb<sup>r</sup> Anno Din 1717.*
